In this month of thankfulness, let's take a moment to consider how we can extend God's love in practical ways within our community and beyond. Here are some suggestions:



Environmental Stewardship

Of the many suggestions we've made for ways to be a good steward of God's creation, recycling is one of the easiest. So we thought it would be a good idea to review the opportunities for recycling in our community, and mention one more that's coming soon.

A review of the recycling projects

- 1. <u>Ripple Glass Project</u>: Place rinsed glass jars and bottles in the purple bin in the Farm King parking lot. Labels can be left on. (If you can't lift your container, just throw the items in one at a time). Note: no bags
- 2. <u>Green Tree Plastics (caps and lids)</u>: Bri is heading up this project at our church. Just place your lids and caps (as designated on the sign) in the containers, and she will take them to the YMCA Daycare where they're sorted and sent away for recycling. Thanks, Bri!
- 3. <u>Aluminum Can Recycling</u>: The Lions Club in Colchester takes aluminum cans for recycling. Address is 207 Fulton Street. Drive through the driveway and you'll see 8 bins. Cans should be rinsed, and can either be loose or in bags.
- 4. <u>Coming Soon</u>: Recycling prescription bottles and caps.
 - Will be collected in a marked bucket in the church (separate from the Green Tree project), stored by Kathy, and then sent to the recycling center in OH.
 - Guidelines: #5 plastic only (to keep it simple).
 - Hopefully this project will be in place by late November.



Pumpkin Smash

Saturday, November 8: If you are looking for a way to get rid of those leftover pumpkins, bring them to the **Pumpkin Smash at Veterans Park** from **10:00 am to 1:00 pm.** Pumpkin Smash is more than just a fun event, it is a community initiative to reduce waste and up-cycle pumpkins into something the community will benefit from.
