



Kelly's Korner

This week we celebrate Youth Sunday. Our youth have had planning sessions for weeks now. They have had and will still have extra rehearsal sessions. A serious approach to worship leadership is being taken by all. I pray you will be excited to hear faith from a younger perspective as you come to worship this week. Please note, things will be a little different than normal. But, a little difference is healthy.

The theme of Youth Sunday is *God, Are You There?* This is a question we have all asked at some point in our lives. In our most difficult and lonely times, we wonder about God's presence. Maybe such a time for you has been the loss of a significant person in your life—whether someone special has moved far away or passed from this life to the next, we experience a time of grief. It is often in these moments that we actually find God's presence. When we have no lower place to go, we find God greeting us there ready to journey with us to a bit higher plateau.

Twelve step programs acknowledge this. Those with addiction issues usually bottom out before seeking help. Often, friends and family members have turned their backs on addicts. The illness of addiction often leads to solitude. The first step in AA is to admit alcohol overpowers and that life has become unmanageable. The rest of the steps are to seek divine help as well as restore relationship with God and (inasmuch as possible) those who have been hurt as a result of the addict's behavior.

Recently, we discussed doubt during worship. The question *God, Are You There* is not really the same as doubt. We can acknowledge that God is...while wondering where God is. Maturity of faith may be able to recognize God's presence in every moment of life. We aspire to have that type of relationship with the divine. Many of us, though, will still often question. Pretty much human nature, really. So, it's ok. God created us to be human. As our youth lead worship this week, may we have a glimpse of God with us. See you Sunday!


