# ANNOUNCING A NEW CHURCH PROJECT: RECYCLING BOTTLE CAPS FOR PLASTIC BENCHES

- A local project where benches will be built for parks and other public places in Macomb;

All CLEAN bottle caps will be collected in buckets placed in the East side and Elevator entrances of our church. Half will be donated to each project. A flier will be distributed during church service sometime in May, which will include detailed instructions on which plastic caps are to be collected.

# Kelly's Korner

Sabbatical is quickly approaching! Just over a year ago, I sat with the Sabbatical Team to finalize our proposal. Thanks to Char Carden, Bob Chatterton, Bill Froom, Patti Jones, and Jean Vaughn for their amazing work to create a grant that allowed for such a wonderful situation for the church. I will be able to have some amazing adventures and so will you. The grant was titled Family. Friends. Frenemy. There will be trips with Anne. There will be trips to visit our families. There is a trip with friends from college and seminary. And there will be books to read about Paul. There will be reading of scripture by Paul (or his disciples) that correspond to the cities to be visited in Greece—Thessalonians, Philippians, and Corinthians primarily. Maybe you have noticed that I rarely preach from the Epistles (or the letters). Paul's writing does not often fit my own style. Sometimes his words do not fit our times—in my opinion. My travels and readings will hopefully open this part of scripture in new ways that I can find inspiration to offer sermons and studies based on Paul's amazing work. The last line of my part of the grant proposal said this: Maybe Paul can become more friend than enemy. This is one goal of the sabbatical.

The grant process was clear to mention that the congregation also needed to participate in this renewal process. Very soon, thanks to the grant monies, your household will receive a book by Adam Hamilton, The Call. This is a great introduction to Paul's ministry for all of us. Well-written. Easy to read. There will be two book studies on May 23 at noon and 5:30 p.m. Please choose to attend one of these. Our new Sr. Minister Intern, Joshua Jackson, will lead. (See page 3 for more info on Josh.) Additionally, the first 4 Sundays in June will bring more opportunity for you. WIU religion professor, Dr. Amy Carr will lead studies on Paul and his work on Sundays June 2, 9, 16, and 23 at 9:00 a.m. Please attend. You know there will be cookies. These studies will provide a good background of information for our future studies and sermons post-sabbatical.

Here is a bit of the itinerary, just in case you are interested in when and where I will be this summer:

- May 30-June 2—Personal Retreat to Benedictine Center in Minneapolis;
- June 18-July 5—Greece trip with visits to Thessoloniki, Philippi, Corinth, Athens, and Santorini;
- July 20-29—Japan with Anne;
- August 5-8—Personal Retreat at the Chiara Center in Springfield, IL.

In between will be the aforementioned trips to family as well as days in Macomb to rest, read, and golf. I return to work on Monday, August 12.

I am grateful for a church that had the gracious foresight to provide a sabbatical in the contract for its minister, who understands the particularly stressful work that ministry can be. I am grateful to the Eli Lilly Foundation for awarding FCC Macomb a grant that makes this time of renewal possible. 
Day 1 – Union Avenue Christian Church – Replacing Lights
