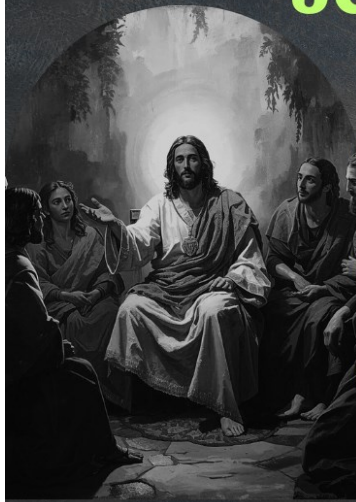

Kelly's Korner

Have you seen the TV show Ted Lasso? It was very popular a few years ago. And is often re-watched by loyal supporters. The premise of Lasso is that a British Premier League soccer team hires an American football coach from Kansas to be their soccer manager. We quickly learn that the team's new owner (who got the team through divorce) wants to drive the organization into the ground, to spite her husband. She has hired a completely inept coach expecting many losses.

There is a poster that gets taped to the top of the doorway leading to Coach Lasso's office. One single word on it. Believe. This poster is significant from the beginning to the end of the series. And, while Coach Lasso has lots of sayings—Taking on a challenge is a lot like riding a horse. If you're comfortable while you're doing it, you're probably doing it wrong; You say impossible, but all I hear is I'm possible; Be a goldfish (referencing their 10-second memory)—it is the way that he genuinely cares for his team that will not allow them to fail.

There are many ups and downs. Ted Lasso perseveres through professional and personal strife. He says

I believe in hope. I believe in 'believe'.

As faithful followers of Christ, we cannot allow a fictional character to have more hope and belief than we do. In our world, at this exact moment, we must step up to overcome the strife we encounter and see on the news or in our social media feeds. We must not let perpetrators of violence tear away the very fabric of our society. We must be the embodiment of love and peace and hope—even when we are tempted not to be the body of Christ just now.

We must believe in hope. We must believe in 'believe'.

For the aims of God to be realized we must live the faith we profess to believe, the kind of faith that leads to hope. Even when it is difficult. Even now.

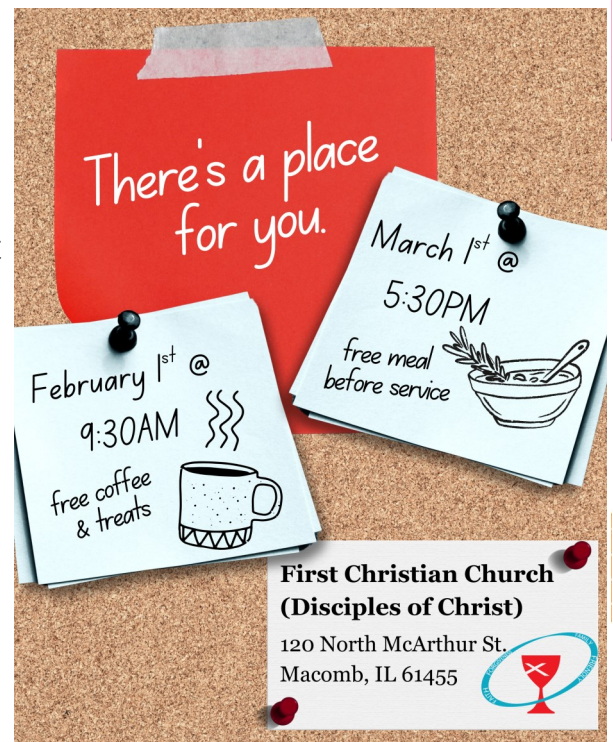

- We are now up to 15 active members, representing six churches in Macomb
- The following is a partial list of our goals and activities:
  - Write environmental education articles for our church newsletters and share them with the committee, to share with their churches. The focus is on “little things you can do...”
  - Educate ourselves: Each member is assigned to present a topic to the committee at each meeting (e.g., composting, plastic pollution)
  - Share resources with the committee
    - E.g., information/projects conducted by individual churches pertaining to creation care and environmental justice
  - Provide information on how people can recycle, via our church newsletters as well as other media

In summary, our committee’s mission is to collaboratively examine, educate, and implement faith based creation care in our respective faith communities. We feel fortunate to have been given this opportunity to be leaders for creation care in the church!

### **Elders**

The Souper Bowl of Caring meal prepared by the Elders will take place on Souper Bowl Sunday, February 8, 2026. A spaghetti meal will be served to inmates at the jail, as well as police and sheriff staff, First Responders, Samaritan Well residents, and several shut-ins, with plans to prepare around 100 meals. This is a wonderful opportunity for outreach in the Macomb community, and we need your help, keep reading to learn how to get involved!

Volunteers are needed on both Saturday, February 7 and Sunday, February 8, 2026. On Saturday, preparations will begin at 9:30 am at the church (following the Men’s Breakfast at 8:00 am), and all helpers are welcome. Please note that the Health Department guidelines require all hair to be pulled back and covered with a hat, and gloves must be worn when handling food (gloves will be provided). On Sunday, volunteers will meet at the church at 1:00 pm to make final preparations, with meals ready by 4:15 pm for delivery to the jail at 4:30 pm. Help is also needed to decorate serving containers and write cards to include with each meal, there is a place for everyone!

You may make food donations or monetary donations. There is a food donation sign-up sheet in the Parlor. Monetary donations may be given to the office clearly marked as “Elders Spaghetti Dinner” or given to Jack McKinnon.

Thank you for your help. The Elders truly appreciate your help with this outreach project.

## **Christian Action & Outreach**

Over the past months Christian Action & Outreach has been busy! We've received three generous donations from our community, enlarging our Emergency Cupboard supplies greatly. This has come at a most helpful time as the government's SNAP program to assist low income people was temporarily halted. FCC responded by doubling the times food is loaded into the Cupboard. It's not unusual for the stocking volunteers to find items left by someone besides our church members. Our committee now has twice as many volunteers assisting, including a concerned community member and some college students. Additionally our ROYALS high school volunteers unload and stock large orders as supplies are replenished. It might surprise you to know that those orders can be over \$1,500 at a time. With the generous donations, luckily we don't need to order monthly but it's a lot of food that is being gratefully received.

Speaking of volunteers: BIG THANK YOU'S go out to several folks!

Those who removed the stored old Boy Scout supplies from the Youth Room closets, cleaned, remodeled, and built additional more usable shelving, and transferred the mountains of food, THANK YOU!! We now have more efficient storage.

Those who continue to stock the Cupboard and those newly started the 2nd shift daily, THANK YOU!!

Those who made the Special Needs Christmas Party so special for our wonderful community, THANK YOU!! As well as so many of our own folks, we had additional help from ROYAL staff and students as well as some lovely ladies from a local African American Christian Sorority. The cool thing is they had so much fun, they asked to be invited back for future FCC events.

Our church is making a difference in our community. It's encouraging others to do the same. Isn't that what our calling of faith is all about?
