Greetings from Denver, friends!

I hope y'all have had a great week so far! I'm definitely enjoying my trip in Denver. The weather is incredible, it's been so much fun being with the Cypress Creek Christian Church high schoolers, and the work we have done has been powerful and good. We've truly been loving and serving a vast variety of our neighbors in holy and wonderful ways.





Yesterday, we volunteered at the Denver location of Volunteers of America to serve lunch to people experiencing homelessness. It was truly a special experience. We got to hear so many stories and talk with a diverse group of individuals. Instead of having our guests move through the line, our group had them go to tables so that we could serve them and help them in however they needed. It was powerful to see some of my youth walking around (more like running) bringing food, lemonade refills, and their smiling faces around to a group of people that our world too often brushes off and avoids by walking to the other side of the street.

Today, we have been serving at the Anchor Center for Blind Children. It's an organization in Denver that supports, provides care for, and gives therapy to children with visual impairments. The hours I have spent here have truly been life-changing. The kids who are here today are here for a "Breakwatch" respite day, a day for their parents or other caregivers to have days to themselves while their children run and play at the Anchor Center. I can't disclose details because of HIPAA, but seeing the smiles from these kids and hearing their infectious laughter has filled my heart and my soul. The best part of this day has been watching the Cypress Creek kids love on and play with these kids, and seeing how much the kids love our group has been the most fulfilling, sweet experience. If you get a chance to look up the Anchor Center, I highly encourage y'all to do so.

Tomorrow, we will return to the Anchor Center for another day of work. Thursday we will go work at the Children's Museum of Denver and we end our work on Friday at the Mullen Home for the Aged. Saturday we have a fun day at Cave of the Winds!

As always, I am grateful to be serving in ministry with y'all. This summer has been such a joy so far, and I'm excited to see what the next two-ish months bring.








CHRISTIAN ACTION & OUTREACH

Benefit for Lucas



Second Pass Offering for Disciples church in Missouri

In May, the Community Christian Church, Disciples of Christ, in Jefferson City, MO, was damaged severely by a tornado. Learning their church building had to be condemned, our congregation was moved to come to their assistance. The church board requested funds from the trustees to add to what would be collected in a "2nd pass offering" on Sunday, June 23rd. \$806 in total was collected and the money has been sent to Disciples Mission Fund, earmarked for the restructuring of the church in Jefferson City. Studying Paul's writings, we learn he encouraged churches to help one another. This is another way FCC reaches out to those in need.
