Andra Moran



Andra Moran lives in Nashville, Tennessee where she works as a songwriter, singer, author, worship designer and freelance touring musician.

The daughter of two insightful, progressive ministers in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), Andra quite literally spent her formative years in sanctuaries and fellowship halls, singing in the children's choir, napping on pews, and later leading music in her youth groups. Her father worked as an Army Chaplain, which took the Moran family all over the world. She grew up making friends from all sorts of backgrounds, seeing people at their best and their worst, and discovering a broad definition of home.

Andra works actively in ecumenical settings, as well as in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and United Church of Christ, providing music at the local, regional and national levels for a variety of gatherings. In addition to her work in concerts and commissioned music, Andra is sought after as a consultant in worship design, modern liturgical music and leadership in churches and denominational conferences across the country.

Andra's music expresses both a deep faith and a mature sense of self. Andra has released six albums in America, the most recent of which is crowd-funded Instarock Records release, *Harmony Grove*. In addition to her English language recordings, Andra's bilingual album *Chant Spontané* was released by the Reform Church of France in 2010. Andra's songs have also been published in contemporary song and hymnal collections and are sung in churches, summer camps and dorm rooms around the world.

In 2012, Andra added "author" to her resume, writing for *One Great Hour of Sharing's* leader devotional guide. Andra authored "K-Tunez Praise," in 2013, a children's collection of devotionals written for Capitol Records / Brentwood Benson. Andra's book, *Brim: Creative Overflow in Worship Design*, co-authored with Rev. Dr. Suzanne Castle, was released in 2013, and is the recipient of the Editor's Choice Award by Worship Leader Magazine, and a top selling worship design resource at national worship gatherings. A *Brim* sequel is in the works and scheduled for a spring 2018 release.

Currently, Andra serves Woodmont Christian Church in Nashville as the part time Creative Director at The Bridge alongside her husband, musician Stephen Daniel King. The couple has a one year old daughter, Calla, named for the lilies in Andra's wedding bouquet. She loves to sing.
