Kelly's Korner

Pentecost is upon us. This is the time when we celebrate the birthday of the church. Maybe you remember the happenings of the first Pentecost celebration. From the time that Israel had been dissolved, the Israelites had been dispersed to all ends of the earth, forming what has been known as the diaspora. Those who lived outside of the holy city of Jerusalem would return on occasion for festivals and holy experiences. The writer of Acts (probably the same writer as the gospel of Luke) tell us in Chapter 2 that "...there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem." Folks had returned to Jerusalem, but after generations of living away, had learned the language of the country in which they had been living.

On the day of Pentecost odd events such as divided flames of tongues rested on each person gathered and a sound like the rush of a violent wind occurred. People were filled with the Holy Spirit and they were able to understand each other in their native languages. Luke says they were sharing stories of God's deeds. Some people observing all this thought the people were drunk. But Peter stood and preached and shared that this was not the case, but God was working in these people to bring about such understanding.

In the 1980's, Leonard Cohen wrote a pop rock song called "Hallelujah." According to Wikipedia Cohen wrote 80 verses to the song before paring it down for recording. The song has been covered by many artists and recognized as one of the greatest songs ever written. I recently saw a Youtube video where three German young people on a singing competition performed Cohen's creation. It was stunning. The song is simple, beautiful and haunting.

Some of the lyrics are biblical recalling David and Samson. Other lyrics are religious in nature, speaking directly to God. One lyric states: *There was a time when you let me know what's really going on below. But now you never show it to me, do you? And remember when I moved in you The holy dove was moving too And every breath we drew was Hallelujah.* These lyrics sum up God for a lot of people. Some may only focus on the fact that God seems distant or non-existent. Others may recognize that along with separation from God, there have been moments of closeness as well.

Cohen reminds us that Hallelujah may take many wonderful and even broken forms. The original Pentecost was a Hallelujah moment. The fact that many people in our day and time feel no connection to God means we need more Pentecost-like and Hallelujah moments. Happy birthday church! Now, get busy.



If you would like to order one to wear at the booth or just around town, see an Evangelism Committee member in the Parlor this Sunday!




Every church was new once; every church had a beginning when congregational leaders planted the church and held the first service. The beginning date for First Christian Church, Macomb, was 1845. (None of us remember being there!) This year's Pentecost Offering is themed *Your Church Was New Once* and invites us to reflect and celebrate the beginning of our existence in Macomb.

Pentecost gifts support the development and growth of new churches. 50% of the offering given is available for new church ministries in the IL-WI Region and 50% supports the General Assembly's New Church Priority that is housed in the Hope Partnership for Missional Transformation. Therefore, you can be sure that 100% directly supports the operating expenses of new congregations and the training of new church pastors, mentors and coaches.

50,000 lives have been brought to Christ through Disciples new churches since 2001. New mission fields are being created and communities are being transformed by new Disciples churches through the United States and Canada. Some of our new church plants worship in languages other than English. At last report, Disciples churches worship in at least 19 different languages.

Think about what the community of Macomb, IL would be like without First Christian Church (DOC) sitting on the corner of Jackson and McArthur all these years. Please pray about giving to the Pentecost Offering to provide opportunities for others to worship as Disciples in their communities.

We will continue to accept this offering on Sunday, June 8.
